





## BUCKSPORT POLICE DEPARTMENT

### MONTHLY REPORT

AUGUST 2016

Chief Sean Geagan:

The Bucksport Police Department would like to officially welcome two new employees. Eze Van Buckley has officially finished his Field Training Program and is on the road. He is cleared to work shifts on his own and is doing a great job!!

We would also like to welcome Lyndsey Tufo to the Animal Shelter. She will be assisting ACO Joy with the duties at this establishment. She will be a welcome addition to this department and we are looking forward to working with her.

The town received a free Speed / Message sign from the state. This has been placed west end of Main Street. I would like to thank the Highway Department for working as a team with us on this project. They placed two permanent poles for this sign at each end of Main Street. I requested this sign several years ago, there is a waiting list for these at this time. The total cost to purchase one of these is 7-8 thousand dollars. I will be looking for one more in the future so that we can have both ends of Main Street covered and will not have to move the signs. I would also like to thank Chris Grindle for helping with the installation and setup of this sign.

Guns and Hoses was active in the community again this month. We partnered with the Heart and Soul group this month and cooked for the community gathering at the Jewett School. This was very well attended and everyone enjoyed the food and time together at this event.

I attended a board meeting at the Bucksport Area Child Care Center this month. I continue to serve on this board. This establishment continues to provide a much needed product to the community.

I continue to work with our local health center with their emergency plan and security at their building. They are working diligently to make this a safer place for their patients and employees.

The Bucksport Public Safety department had a Department of Labor inspection this month. This is part of the SHAPE program that Chief Bowden has set up. The inspection went well overall. The Police Department had a few areas to look at and this is already underway.

Sergeant Winchester and I attended a review of the Boston Marathon bombing incident this month at Husson University. This was presented by the FBI, Watertown PD, and victims of the bombing. There were many lessons to be learned from this training along with hearing the good and the bad from one of the victims.

**Sergeant David Winchester:**

During the month of August, Sergeant Winchester, Assistant Harbor Master David Grant and Officer Dan Harlan met with US Customs & Border Protection to discuss security along the Penobscot River. The United States Department of Homeland Security is currently working on a long term protect to offer better security and a more Law Enforcement presence along vulnerable areas the river.

Sergeant Winchester and several Officers participated in a Guns & Hoses event this month at the Jewett School. The event was a community event that allowed the Department to visit with members of the community during a BBQ. The event was well attended by the community and members of the Police and Fire Departments.

Chief Geagan and Sergeant Winchester attended an Investigation Review Training of the Boston Marathon Bombings at Husson College this month. Members of the panel included FBI agents, the Chief of Police from Watertown (Massachusetts), Federal Prosecutors and a survivor from the actual Marathon bombing. The panel discussed the entire event including the positives and negatives of the investigation and the multi-jurisdictional cooperation of numerous agencies.

Sergeant Winchester, Officer Findlay, Officer Knight, Officer Schmidt, Officer Van Buckley, Fire Fighter John Gavelek and Dispatcher Chris Grindle participated in this year's Special Olympics Fueling for Dreams event at the local Irving. Members of the Public Safety pumped gas from members of the community for donations for the Special Olympics. The event was well received and the Department received several hundred dollars in donations. 100% of the proceeds went to the Special Olympics.

Members of the Penobscot Valley 4-wheel Club stopped at the Bucksport Police Department this month to support local Law Enforcement. The group was clad in pro Law Enforcement emblems stopped at the Police Department to pose for pictures with Sergeant Winchester and Officer Schmidt. They also provided homemade signs made by the children of the group.

### Patrol:

The patrol division had 10 arrests, 25 citations, 128 warnings and 182 violations, for a total of 207 contacts this month. There were 397 CAD calls for police services this month. The patrol division handled 21 motor vehicle accidents this month. I have included a map of all the calls for service for the Police Department this month.

Officer Matt Schmidt had 11 summons, 37 warnings and 67 violations, Sergeant Winchester had 5 summons, 23 warnings, 40 violations, Officer Findlay had 4 summons, 18 warnings and 22 violations, Officer VanBuckley had 3 summons, 24 warnings, 32 violations, Officer Knight had 1 summons, 9 warnings, 17 violations, Officer Welch had 1 summons, 7 warnings, 14 violations, Officer Marcel had 3 warnings, 6 violations, Officer Harlan had 3 warning, 5 violations, ACO Joy had 2 warnings, 2 violations, Officer Marcel had 1 warning, 2 violations, Officer Bishop had 1 warning, 1 violation, Chief Geagan had 1 warning, 1 violation. A partial list of complaints handled along with percentage of time spent for the month are attached to this report.

Officer Matt Schmidt had a call of a stranded deer in alligator pond this month. Officer Schmidt went into the pond to get the deer and got it back to land. Although the deer unfortunately did not survive, Officer Schmidt went above and beyond on this call, A job well done!!! I have included a picture of Officer Schmidt at this call. .

We are in the process of a new UCR report under the Spillman system. The department has six areas of crime that are reported each month to the uniform crime reporting system. These areas cover; Criminal Homicide, Forcible Rape, Robbery, Assault, Burglary and Theft. In the month of August we had 0 Criminal Homicides, 0 Forcible Rape, and 1 Robbery. We had 3 assaults, 1 was unfounded, 0 burglaries, we had 5 thefts, 2 were unfounded. 10 actual offenses reported, 3 were unfounded, leaving 7 actual and we cleared 7 of the 7. Cases can be cleared by an arrest or exceptional means. This means that the case was solved in one form or another.

### School Resource Officer

In the month of August Officer Marcel finished his patrol on the bicycle on the waterfront. Overall this went very well. I received a lot of comments from the boating community on the waterfront on this. He will now be starting back in the schools for another year.

### Dispatch:

In the month of August the dispatch center made 4786 radio log entries. A total list from the new system is attached to this report, this includes percentages. All of these calls are taken by the dispatch and put into the computer aided dispatch system and dispatch to the appropriate units. The dispatch center completed 1 burn permit this month; they completed 2 concealed weapons permits. They also completed Court Work, Payroll, and Purchase Orders for billing purposes along with answering all calls and greeting the public at the Public Safety Building.

**Animal Control:**

In the month of August Officer Joy handled 22 animal complaints. Officer Joy took in 1 cat and 1 dog from Bucksport, 2 dogs from Orland, 1 cat from Prospect, 13 cats from Hampden. He had 2 dogs and 1 cat reclaimed, 2 cats were adopted this month, and 2 cats were transferred to another facility. We again would like to welcome Lyndsey Tufo to the Animal Shelter as the new Animal Shelter Assistant. She is a welcomed addition to this facility and we are looking forward to the expertise she will bring with her.

**Police Advisory Committee:**

The Police Advisory Committee did not meet month, the committee is now officially on summer break.

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

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


